

What does Northern Pakistan mean?





Who introduced new characters?

- Local language activists, mostly supported by field researchers of SIL international (formerly Summer Institute of Linguistics)
- SIL works on the undocumented smaller languages of the North Pakistan
- They help local language activists to make orthography of their languages

- Local activists make Language Committees on community basis to decide orthography issues
- SIL International conducts training workshops on linguistic software

• Frontier Language Institute, FLI, Peshawar is the major linguistic resource center for the language activists.

Preferred Script of the smaller languages of northern Pakistan

Almost all the language communities have decided to adapt modified Indo-Perso-Arabic script for their languages, except Wakhi community who preferred to write in Latin script. Some elements among the Balti and Kalasha communities also insist to write in scripts other than the Indo-Perso-Arabic script.
