A project supported by the **MDG3 Fund** and implemented by the **APC Women's Networking and Support Programme** through local partners **BytesforAll** and **P@SHA**



“Take Back the Tech! to End violence against women and girls” exposes the connections between violence against women and ICTs in practice & policy in 12 countries. It has 3 main objectives:

- to build and strengthen the capacity of women, girls and women's rights organisations to use, reclaim and shape ICTs to stop violence against women and girls
- to create platforms and opportunities for women and girls to critically engage with ICTs to combat violence, and as survivors of violence, to contribute towards self and collective healing
- to build feminist analysis, particularly around the intersections of violence against women and ICT into global, regional and national ICT policy processes

As part of our work in Pakistan the **APC WNSP**, through **P@SHA** and **Bytes for All** called for proposals for projects that seek to address the intersection between violence against women and girls, and/or to stop violence against women and girls through the strategic use of information and communication technologies (ICTs). The response was wonderful - of these, five projects have been selected.
