

If a singular masculine noun ends in 'a' or 'h' sound, the plural is made by changing the 'a' or 'h' sound to 'ey'


#### Masculine nouns ending in vowels

• If a singular masculine noun ends in 'a' or 'h' sound, the plural is made by changing the 'a' or 'h' sound to 'ey' e.g. larka (s) vs. larkey (p)

#### Number agreement with adjectives

#### Masculine adjective 'a'/'ah'

- The adjectives ending on vowels change in the same manner with the noun
  - Peela patta (The yellow leaf)
  - Peeley pattey (The yellow leaves)

#### Masculine adjective consonant

- The adjectives ending on consonant do not change in plural
  - Sufaid patta (The white leaf)
  - Sufaid pattey (The white leaves)


### Number agreement with verbs
